Project Proposal: Community Centre for Education and Mental Health at Phugewadi

Organization: Dnyansangam Foundation

Location: Phugewadi, Pimpri-Chinchwad

Focus Areas: Education Equity & Mental Health Support

1. Executive Summary

Dnyansangam proposes to establish a Community Centre in Phugewadi that seamlessly integrates education equity with mental health support. This centre will serve as a safe and nurturing space for children, youth, and families to access quality learning opportunities while addressing their emotional and psychological wellbeing.

By recognizing that a child cannot thrive academically without emotional stability, and that mental health challenges often stem from educational struggles, this model creates a cycle of holistic empowerment. The proposed centre aims to nurture not just informed learners but resilient, empathetic, and confident individuals who can positively impact their community.

2. Background & Rationale

Phugewadi, a semi-urban settlement in Pimpri-Chinchwad, faces overlapping challenges:

- Limited access to quality education, especially for first-generation learners.
- Academic gaps leading to low confidence and dropouts.
- High levels of stress, anxiety, and stigma around mental health.
- Lack of safe, structured spaces for creative expression and dialogue.



Why Interlink Education & Mental Health?

- Educational Struggles → Mental Health Impact: Children facing academic difficulties often experience anxiety, low self-esteem, and isolation.
- Mental Health Challenges → Educational Setbacks: Emotional distress or trauma hinders focus, attendance, and learning outcomes.
- Community Stressors: Economic pressures, migration, and social conflicts affect both schooling and wellbeing.

Therefore, addressing both dimensions together ensures lasting change, breaking cycles of underachievement and stigma.

3. Objectives

1. Improve Academic Outcomes: Provide academic support, remedial learning, and creative educational activities for children and adolescents.
2. Strengthen Mental Wellbeing: Deliver counseling, awareness programs, and psychosocial interventions for students, parents, and youth.
3. Normalize Conversations on Mental Health: Reduce stigma by integrating wellbeing practices into everyday community learning.
4. Build Community Leadership: Train youth and parents as facilitators and wellbeing advocates to sustain long-term impact.

4. Proposed Activities

Educational Initiatives

- After-school remedial learning circles (Math, Science, Literacy).
- Bridge programs for dropouts and slow learners.
- Career guidance and academic counseling.



- Creative modules like theatre, art, and storytelling to foster critical thinking.

Mental Health Interventions

- One-on-one and group counseling sessions.
- Peer support groups for adolescents and women.
- Workshops on stress management, empathy, resilience, and emotional regulation.
- Expressive activities: trekking, open mics, art therapy sessions.

Community Engagement

- Monthly Dialogue Circles: bringing parents, teachers, and youth together.
- Mental health awareness campaigns (street plays, discussions, posters).
- Capacity-building workshops for youth leaders on empathy, collaboration, and conflict resolution.

5. Interlinking Education and Mental Health

The Phugewadi Community Centre is designed as a blended model where education and mental health reinforce each other:

- Learning Circles + Counseling: Students attending remedial classes also have access to counseling to address exam stress, learning anxieties, and family pressures.
- Creative Expression as Dual Tool: Theatre, storytelling, and art not only improve literacy and confidence but also serve as therapeutic outlets for emotions.
- Parental Engagement: Workshops on parenting skills support children's academic growth while reducing home-based stressors.
- Youth Leadership: Training peer mentors builds confidence (educational impact) while fostering responsibility and resilience (mental health impact).



This approach ensures holistic development, where improved education outcomes contribute to stronger mental health, and mental wellbeing, in turn, enhances the ability to learn and thrive.

6. Expected Impact

- Children: Enhanced learning outcomes, reduced dropout rates, and increased confidence.
- Youth: Greater leadership skills, emotional resilience, and employability.
- Parents: Increased awareness of emotional needs and supportive parenting practices.
- Community: Reduced stigma around mental health, creation of safe spaces, and stronger bonds through collective learning.

7. Monitoring & Evaluation

- Academic progress tracked via pre- and post-assessments.
- Emotional wellbeing tracked through counseling feedback and wellbeing scales.
- Community participation measured through attendance and qualitative feedback.
- Regular impact reports shared with stakeholders.

8. Call to Action

Dnyansangam invites support to co-create a model community centre where education and mental health are not parallel but deeply interwoven pathways to transformation. By investing in this initiative, funders will enable a sustainable shift in the Phugewadi community — nurturing brighter minds and stronger hearts



Statement of Project Need

1. Current Problem

Phugewadi, a semi-urban settlement in Pimpri-Chinchwad, faces two interlinked challenges: limited access to quality education and a lack of mental health support. Children struggle with academic gaps, low confidence, and high dropout rates. At the same time, families and youth experience stress, anxiety, and stigma around mental health, with no safe spaces to seek help or express themselves.

2. Who is Affected

- Children and Adolescents: Struggle with academic performance, self-esteem, and stress.
- Youth: Face limited opportunities for skill-building and emotional support, leading to frustration and lack of direction.
- Parents & Families: Experience stress from financial and social pressures, unable to provide adequate academic or emotional support to children.
- Community at Large: Faces cycles of underachievement, stigma around mental health, and lack of safe, collective growth spaces.

3. Why it is Important to Solve

If these issues remain unaddressed, children will continue to fall behind academically, resulting in higher dropout rates and limited career opportunities. Simultaneously, unacknowledged mental health challenges can deepen into severe emotional distress, substance abuse, or cycles of violence. Education and mental health cannot be separated—both must be addressed together for long-term, sustainable community transformation.

4. What Exact Change Will Occur Through Funding

Funding will enable Dnyansangam to establish a Community Centre at Phugewadi that integrates education and mental health support under one roof.

- Children will receive remedial education, academic guidance, and creative learning opportunities.

- The community will access professional counseling, awareness workshops, and safe spaces for emotional wellbeing.
- Youth will be trained as facilitators and leaders, ensuring sustainability and ownership within the community.

This centre will create visible improvements in academic outcomes, reduced stigma around mental health, and stronger community resilience — making it a replicable model for other underserved areas.
